The information ,in the form of suggestions ,queries ,etc., flows from the governing body -management committee and finance committee to the decision making administrative and academic peoples under the leadership and guidance of the Principal for effective implementation.

6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

6.3.1 Curriculum Development

AS, our college is affiliated to the RTM Nagpur University , Nagpur, there is no curriculum development flexibility. However, few members of the college represents as a member of the Board of studies in the University for curriculum designing . The college collects feedbacks/suggestions from all its stakeholders –students, faculty, parents, alumni, employers, community and academic peers. The BOS members of the college takes up the responsibility to communicate these suggestions to the university statutory bodies to be incorporated from time to time.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

The college put faith in investments in the state of the art technology for promoting innovative teaching and learning methodology. We motivated our faculty to follow following methods, in addition to the regular black board teaching method.

- 1 Use of charts, O.H.P. and L.C. D. projector.
- 2 Interactive board learning.
- 3 Computer based teaching.
- 4 Group discussion and interactive teaching methods.
- 5 ICT enabled teaching process.
- 6 Teaching through field visits and visits to national/state research institutes.
- 7 Demonstration using models.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

University Examination and evaluation patterns are some what different from that of higher secondary board examination. Therefore, newly admitted students are make aware of the university Examination and evaluation pattern, by our faculty members. The evaluation process consists of continuous assessment and end semester examination given equal weightage . An innovative evaluation technique are adopted by certain faculty members are students seminars/assignments/projects/data collection and analysis.

6.3.4 Research and Development

The college has an active research cell consist of a convener and members who are actively engaged in research or having strong experience in the field of research. The college has 40 permanent teaching faculty of that, most are Ph.D. holders and some are in the process of submission of Ph.D. thesis. Currently 09 college faculty members are Ph.D. guide and under them 14 students are registered for Ph.D. and five (5) students awarded Ph.D. by the university under the able guidance of our faculty. A teaching member of the science faculty received **Best Paper presentation award** in the conference. Currently three minor research projects are running with total sanctioned outlay of Rs.2,90,000/- from different funding agencies. All the faculty members have been attending conferences, symposia, workshop /short term course etc., to updates the subject knowledge and some of them are presenting papers in conferences, symposia while, others are publishing their research work in the form of paper/ research articles in journal of national and international repute with high impact factor. Total number of papers presented /published are fifty (50). Some departments encourage and shaping brain of undergraduate students for research by exposing them to project analysis, seminar papers, reading research articles and assignment write-up . Some faculty members are the author and co authors of text books and have also contributed chapters to text books.

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

Library:- The college Library is the reservoir of the knowledge of an educational institute. To spread fragrance of the knowledge through the books and precious literature, a well defined traditional system is present in the college library. The college has a full time Librarian supported by his associates, and a library committee, consisting of 6-7 faculty members for the smooth working of library. The library is equipped with **Customized Library Automation Software** and had been upgraded by **Bi-Lingual Soft Lib Ver 4.0**. At present, the accession, issue and return and OPAC services in the library are partially computerized. The library is also provided with two separate nodes for INTERNET service to students and staff members. Display for new arrivals is in practice for recent updates. Separate reading rooms are made available for students and staff members.

Information Communication Technology(ICT):-The college is in favour of adopting policies and strategies for the up gradation of technologies in academic and administration. The ICT facilities and other computer based learning resources are adequately available in the institution. Most of the departments and staff rooms are equipped with internet and computers, so that, the faculty keeps on update themselves. Keeping in mind, the rapid advancement in technology and students benefits, college has installed LCD projector in conference hall and another kept free for use for faculty members for teaching purposes. The college computer laboratory is equipped with LAN with internet for students. Department of English provides opportunities for hands on computer based language training to the students.

Physical Infrastructure/ Instrumentation:- The college houses in two, double storied buildings. In front of the college, main building occupies two administrative offices with sufficient numbers of working counters for students attached with a Principal's cabin. The ground floor engaged for Commerce faculty while the first floor for the Arts faculty attached with their respective staff rooms. The science faculty houses in science building. In science wing, separate staff cabins are provided to every departments attached to their laboratories. Each floor of buildings are provided with sufficient numbers of separate lavatories for male and female students. The college has seminar hall/ conference room with audio visual internet extended facility, well furnished classrooms, well equipped laboratories, a separate library building, girls common room, guest house, games field, a canteen, parking for bicycles and vehicles. Separate cabins are provided to N.C.C., N.S.S., games and sports department, research cell, YCMOU, College credit co-operative society and separate record room. A medicinal plants garden, digital notice board with LCD screen, Fire extinguisher in lab and college premises are present.

From UGC assistance for infrastructure enrichment, chemistry, physics, home-economics laboratories were upgraded by adding new instruments. In previous year, chemistry, physics, botany, zoology ,home-economic, geography and computer science labs., were also upgraded from UGC assistance for infrastructure. Residential facilities for female students are underway.

6.3.6 Human Resource Management

In college, an annual direct recruitment system is working where at the beginning and end of the academic year the management committee reviews the existing position of vacancies and appoints personnel in teaching and non-teaching following the state Govt. and UGC norms. Recreational programmes are organised for teaching and non teaching staff.

The college allows teaching and non teaching staff to take part in Orientation ,refresher and training programmes, organised by different organisation to enhanced capacities of need based work.

Computer department of the college takes initiative for computer training classes for staff member to increase the computer literacy among the staff.

Department of games and sports of the college organised medical check up camp for students during academic session.

6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

Recruitment of permanent staff members are strictly on the basis of state Govt. and UGC norms. Advertisements inviting application from qualified candidates are published in leading newspapers. Applicants who meet the eligibility laid down by Govt. authorities , are called for Interview cum demo teaching . The selection panel consists of the Principal, Secretary, member of the management, Head of the concerned dept. ,two subject experts nominated by Uni. Management and a V.C. nominee nominated by Hon'ble Vice Chancellor of the University. Candidates found suitable are appointed by the college management for one year of probation period following the Hon'ble V.C. approval recommended by selection committee. They are further given a permanent position by the management after satisfactory performance.

6.3.8 Industry Interaction / Collaboration

No MOU with industries, however Dr. K. N. Sathawane , Dr. M.F. Jadhao and Dr. R. K. Dipte of our college extending their knowledge to, the cultivators of watermelon, local farmers for pest control in paddy crop and proper grammatically correct composition in schools of this area , respectively.

The admission of the students in Science faculty is on the basis of merits. While in Commerce and Arts faculties the admission of the students are on first come first serve basis. During admission of students, a proper care is taken to follow the reservation and other norms given by the Govt. and UGC.
