6.3.1 Curriculum Development

There is no flexibility for curriculum development, as our college is non-autonomous and is affiliated to the RTM Nagpur University , Nagpur . However, few members of the college represent as members of the Board of Studies in the University for curriculum designing . The college collects feedbacks/suggestions from all its stakeholders –students, faculty, parents, alumni, employers, community and academic peers. The BOS members of the college takes up the responsibility to communicate these suggestions to the university statutory bodies to incorporate..

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

The college puts faith in promoting innovative teaching and learning methodology. We motivated our faculty to follow following methods, in addition to the regular black board teaching method.

- 1 Use of charts, O.H.P. and L.C. D. projector.
- 2 Interactive board learning.
- 3 Computer based teaching.
- 4 Group discussion and interactive teaching methods.
- 5 ICT enabled teaching process.
- 6 Teaching through field visits and visits to national/state research institutes.
- 7 Demonstration using models.
- 8 Showing on screen popular dramas, acts, etc

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

University Examination and evaluation patterns are somewhat different from that of higher secondary board examination. Therefore, newly admitted students are made aware of the university Examination and evaluation pattern by our faculty members. The evaluation process consists of continuous assessment and end semester examination is given equal weightage. Innovative evaluation techniques are adopted by certain faculty members viz. students seminars/assignments/projects/data collection and analysis.

6.3.4 Research and Development

Research cell is established in our college. One of the faculty member has been appointed as the coordinator / convener with a team of members, who are engaged in research. The college has 38 permanent teaching faculty of that, most are Ph.D. holders and some are in the process of submission of Ph.D. thesis. Currently 10 college faculty members are Ph.D. guide and under them 27 students are registered for Ph.D. and five (5) students have been awarded Ph.D. by the university under the able guidance of our faculty. A teaching member of the Arts faculty received **Best Paper presentation award** in the conference held at Pune. Currently one minor research project is running with total sanctioned outlay of Rs.200000 /- . Most of the faculty members are attending conferences, symposia, workshop /short term course etc., to update the subject knowledge and some of them are presenting papers in conferences, symposia while, others are publishing their research work in the form of paper/ research articles in journal of national and international repute with high impact factor. Total number of papers presented /published are forty two(42). Some departments encourage and shape brain of undergraduate students for research by exposing them to project analysis, seminar papers, reading research articles and assignment write-up. Some faculty members are the author and co authors of text books and have also contributed chapters to text books.

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

Library:- The college Library is the reservoir of the knowledge of an educational institute. To spread fragrance of the knowledge through the books and precious literature, a well defined traditional system is present in the college library. The college has a full time Librarian assisted by his associates, and a library committee, consisting of 6-7 faculty members for the smooth working of library. The library is equipped with **Customized Library Automation Software** and had been upgraded by **Bi-Lingual Soft Lib Ver 4.0**. At present, the accession, issuing and returning and OPAC services in the library are partially computerized. The library is also provided with two separate nodes for INTERNET service to students and staff members. Display of new arrivals is in practice for recent updates. Separate reading rooms are made available for students and staff members. College library works for fostering reading habit among the students.

Information Communication Technology(ICT):-The college is upgrading the available technologies in academic and administration time to time. In the current session some computers have been added. The ICT facilities and other computer based learning resources are adequately available in the institution. Most of the departments and staff rooms are equipped with internet and computers, so that, the faculty keeps on updating themselves. Keeping in mind, the rapid advancement in technology and students benefits, college has installed LCD projector in conference hall and another is kept free for the use of faculty members for teaching purposes. The college computer laboratory is equipped with LAN with internet for students. Department of English provides opportunities for hands on computer based language training to the students. Indicative informations are displayed by using Electronic display board.

Physical Infrastructure/ Instrumentation:- The college houses in two, double storied buildings. In front of the college, the main building occupies two administrative offices with sufficient numbers of working counters for students attached with the Principal's cabin. The ground floor is engaged for Commerce faculty while the first floor for the Arts faculty attached with their respective staff rooms. The science faculty houses in science building. In science wing, separate staff cabins are provided to every departments attached to their laboratories. All the departments of science faculty are equipped with the state of the art laboratories. Each floor of buildings are provided with sufficient numbers of separate lavatories for male and female students. The college has seminar hall/ conference room with audio visual internet extended facility, well furnished classrooms, well equipped laboratories, a separate library building, girl's common room, guest house, field for games, a canteen, parking for bicycles and vehicles. Separate cabins are provided to N.C.C., N.S.S., games and sports department, research cell, YCMOU, College credit co-operative society and separate record room. A medicinal plants garden, digital notice board with LCD screen, Fire extinguishers in laboratories and college premises are present. Residential facilities for female students are underway. IQAC houses in a separate room with furniture and computer and printer.

6.3.6 Human Resource Management

- ❖ Recruitment is made by direct recruitment system, where appointments are made in teaching and non-teaching staff following the state Govt. and UGC norms.
- ❖ Recreational programmes are organised for teaching and non-teaching staff by games and sports departments.
- ❖ The college allows teaching and non-teaching staff to take part in Orientation, Refresher and other training programmes.
- ❖ Computer department of the college takes initiative for computer training classes for staff member to enhance the computer literacy among the staff.
- ❖ Department of games and sports of the college organised medical check up camp for students during academic session.
- ❖ Yoga training classes are conducted by Games and Sports department.

6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

- ❖ Recruitment of permanent staff members are strictly on the basis of state Govt. and UGC norms. Advertisements inviting application from qualified candidates are published in leading newspapers. Applicants who fulfil the eligibility criterion laid down by Govt. authorities, are called for Interview cum demo teaching. The selection panel consists of the Principal, Secretary, member of the management, Head of the concerned dept., two subject experts nominated by University Management and a V.C. nominee nominated by Hon'ble Vice Chancellor of the University. Candidates found suitable are appointed by the college management for one year of probation period following the Hon'ble V.C. approval recommended by selection committee. They are further given a permanent position by the management after satisfactory performance.

6.3.8 Industry Interaction / Collaboration

Dr. K. N. Sathawane, Dr. M.F. Jadhao and Dr. R. K. Dipte of our college have been extending their knowledge to the cultivators of watermelon, local farmers for pest control in paddy crop and proper grammatically correct composition in schools of this area, respectively without any consultancy fees.

1 Title of the practice:-	Guidance to the students for Competitive Examination and Career Development.
Objective	To inculcate competitive habit in the students for competitions. To develop personal smartness.
Context	Our college is located in semi-urban/urban area in Bhandara district of Maharashtra state. This region is poor in financial as well as in education. NO efforts or very poor efforts have been made by the other institutes in the town, as a results, most of the students are not aware of, the competition, competitive examinations, etc,. Our students graduate in BA, B.Com, B.Sc. and post graduate in M.A. and M.Com.. In recent past these traditional programmes helped them in employment, however, at present their values have been limited in acquiring basic qualifications and not for jobs. Until and unless our students prepared for competition, they will not get placements in government, semi- Government and private sectors. Keeping in mind these lacunae , college has decided to start classes on competitive examination and to develop smartness in students to do better and face interview positively. The Career Placement and Guidance Cell is established under the guidance of teachers whose past experience will help the execution of practice more effectively. The cell is engaging and organising classes, guest lectures and test examination around the academic year.
The practice	In the beginning of the academic session , students are made aware of the availabilities of such classes in the college and their importance in the present context . An appeal is also made to the students for enrolment . In first session, course in-charge and lecturers of college inform details about the competition ,competitive examinations and their importance in career. In the mid of the session, workshops ,guest lectures, are organised . Using power point

	<p>presentation , information is given on different examination of commissions, pattern of question papers ,books and the syllabi of different examinations . On screen interview of successful students are shown to built confidence amongst participating students. Information about how to write answers of questions on OMR sheets is also given to the enrolled students.</p> <p>Regular training classes on the above said courses were started, which cover Current affairs, English grammar, Hindi grammar, Marathi grammar, selected subject on Pol. Sciences, G. K. and etc. by college teachers till the completion of session .</p> <p>In the month of December,2014 a books exhibition cum sale was organised in association with M/s Nathe Publication , Nagpur and many other publication books on competitive examination were displayed for information as well as for sales.</p> <p>In the month of February 2015 a common test examination was conducted . About 400 students appeared and those ranked First, Second and Third were awarded by distributing prizes at the hands of invited guests and the college Principal. On this occasion Hon'ble guest guided our students for competitive examination and career.</p>

It is the only multi faculty institutes catering education in three faculties namely Arts, Commerce in U.G and P.G while U.G. programmes in Science. Most of the admitted students are from remote villages/ nearby villages and very few from the town. Our observation is that, many students are clever, hard working, however, they failed to compete with students from city due to lack of extra smartness (like, art of expression, participation in cultural activities, G. K. ,debate, quiz, anchoring, organization of programme, stage management ,and many more) since ,they have no exposure to handle such events or not participated in past or lack of interest.</p> <p>Secondly , in Tumsar town there are very few organisation promoting events/ providing opportunities to the students. Hence, college has decided to provide a platform to the student through which many extracurricular activities are organised with the view of generating interest among the students for participation in such activities. College formed the associations. The college associations are the best platform to execute the extracurricular activities.</p> <p>Keeping in mind the students benefits ,Art, Commerce and Science Associations of the college are working hard to carry out extracurricular activities for the overall development of the students since many years in the college.</p>
The practice	<p>In the beginning of the academic session , the college staff council appoints one of the teaching staff members as the convener/Teacher In-charge of the respective association . After finalising the admission the convener nominates the students from each class as members of the association. A meeting is called along with teachers wherein finalised the working body of the association for a session comprising President, Vice- President Secretary, Joint Secretary, Treasurer, members and events subcommittee of the students to organise events throughout the year under</p>

Inauguration is followed by organising many events. The outstanding students are advised and guided accordingly to compete further higher level, viz. University, State or a National ,etc. competitions. At the end of the session prizes are distributed. All the events/ programmes of the association are organised by the students , with consultation of the Teacher in-Charge.</p>
